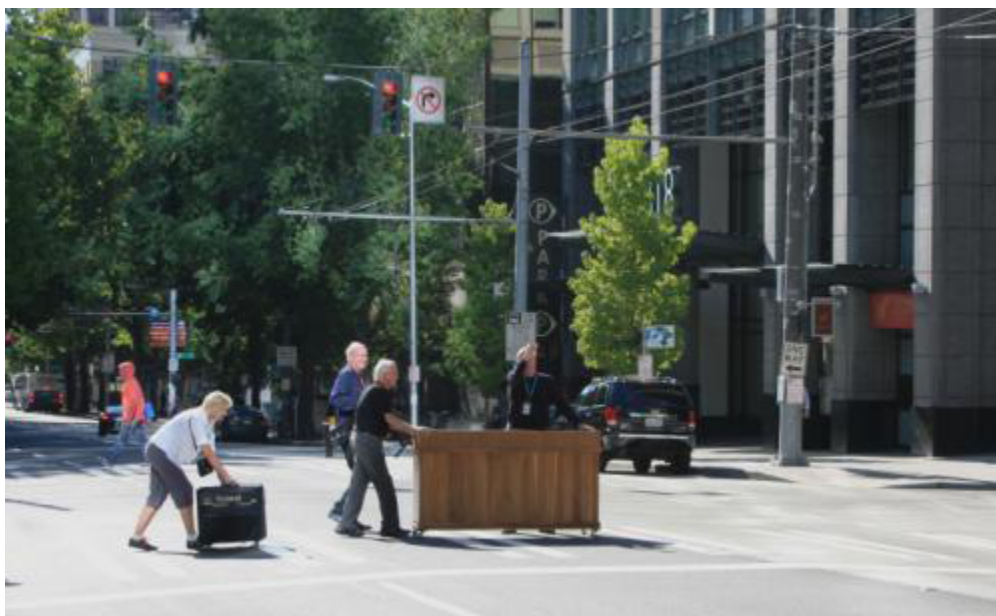

Pastor's Cup...

Two months ago I concluded my article with this prayer from our Evening Prayers:

"O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."

That prayer is taking on more meaning for us, isn't it? We have moved out of our familiar spaces at 911 Stewart St. On a rain soaked October 10th Sunday, we trod across Stewart St. from our church home to the eleventh floor at 1900 9th Ave. in the Children's Hospital Research Institute and held worship. Like Moses heard from God, we, too, heard from God, "My presence will go with you..." We, too, have found favor in God's sight. Our worship was warm, intimate, full of praise and hospitality. We were very pleased over how smoothly the worship transition had taken place.

The church staff is busy getting settled in at Denny Park Lutheran Church. The Community Services Ministry has started up. We are aware that new office settings call for modified arrangements when it comes to serving the people whom we care for, who come for their mail, vouchers, Washington ID's, or one on one time with Karen Snider, our Community Services Director. Slowly, it is all falling into place. Again, as Moses first heard, we hear again from God, "My presence will go with you..."

Soup & Movies, under the capable care of Pat Champion, is at full strength with the numbers of guests being served. Denny Park Lutheran Church is thankful to us for having the opportunity to witness and serve those in need of a meal and fellowship.

Through all of this Gethsemane members are not going through this alone. Read a note what was sent to the church, as a response from reading the article in the Seattle Times:

Grow Report

On October 6 and 7 Hansen Moving Company essentially moved Gethsemane to three different locations. The offices and GCS moved to Denny Park Office Complex, Gregory Keels, our custodian and security person was moved to his new apartment, and the saved furniture and furnishings were moved and stored with Hansen Storage Company. By October 31, Gethsemane will be ready for the next step which is turning the building over to RAFN construction. They will start with asbestos abatement.

We received a very favorable article in the Seattle Times Monday, Oct. 4 edition about our project and have heard many, many good comments about what we are doing to help those in need in our neighborhood. As a result of the newspaper article, we have received donations for our project and new visitors to our Sunday worship service.

On Sunday, Oct. 10 Gethsemane worshiped on the 11th floor of Children's Hospital Research Center, which is right across Stewart St. from Gethsemane. It is a very wonderful space and we cannot thank Children's Hospital enough for their generosity during our time of construction.

Long story short – Good move, good publicity, and good neighbor



Dear Members and Friends of Gethsemane,

With the Parish council's approval, the following organizations have been named by the Social Ministry Committee to receive funds from the Fall Appeal drive. You will receive an envelope in the mail and may designate your gift(s) to one or all of these incredibly important programs that carry out the work of our Lord here in Seattle and in other parts of the world.

The Council has approved the following recipients:

- **Gethsemane Community Services (GCS)**
- **Gethsemane Soup and Movies**
- **The French-Speaking Protestant Church of Moscow, our partner congregation:**
Members of our partner congregation come primarily from French-speaking African nations and work and study in Moscow. The church runs several outreach programs including one that resembles our own Soup and Movies. These projects must be heavily financed through member contributions and Moscow is one of the world's most expensive cities. A delegation will be traveling to Moscow in February and our monetary gift will be personally delivered by one of the delegates.
- **The Ethiopia Project Task Force:** The NW Washington Synod (ELCA) is helping the North Central Synod of the Mekane Yesus Church of Ethiopia by raising funds to start a chicken hatchery at the former Haik Orphanage Compound in Ethiopia. The orphanage is no longer operating as an orphanage although support is still given for vocational training and care. Funds raised for the hatchery project will benefit the Ethiopian Church. Funds will also support someone from our Synod "on the ground" for several months in Ethiopia. The Ethiopian Church has said: "The project is intended to generate income to support evangelism work in our Synod, particularly through training of the church leaders." The chicken hatchery in Ethiopia will produce day old chicks which will be sold to members of the community to provide employment, meat and eggs. Community training in animal husbandry is planned later. The Ethiopia Project Task Force started its work in July 2010, and is under the direction of the NW Washington Synod Bishop's Office.

Soup and Movies, Thank You Denny Park

This has been a very exciting time for Gethsemane's meal program, Saturday Soup and Movies. As we await the new chapter in Gethsemane's life, we have been blessed to have one of our sister congregations, Denny Park Lutheran, agree to let us use their space every Saturday for our vital meal program. Had we not had this opportunity to use their space, and would have had to shut down the program, thousands of people would go without a hot meal on the weekends, and it would have been very difficult to restart after being closed for 18 months. We thank Denny Park from our hearts for sharing their space with us.

Change within the homeless community, especially, is very difficult to manage. After years in the same space at Gethsemane, seeing the same volunteers and coordinators, and being extremely comfortable in that space, to move to a strange place is very difficult. Are those running the program, and volunteering going to be the same? Will there be all new people running the program? Will the way the lunch is offered change?, or Will the new space be as understanding of the homeless community?, and Will they feel comfortable in the new place?. These questions all create fear within people.

The first few Saturdays were attended by only 45-60 people, partly due to the fears of our guests. For some, the change in location made a difference, for some it was more difficult to eat and use the Urban Rest Stop, as many who came to Gethsemane did. Many wanted to wait and see what others would say about the program in its new spot, and some, for a variety of reasons, including those of mental health, were unsure to make the change.

Once they came and saw that location was the only thing that had changed, the numbers have increased to 80-99 folks each Saturday. As time goes on, and we pick up new people from the neighborhood, we will be up to our average of 100 people each Saturday. We have also been truly blessed by our regular volunteers who have committed to their particular Saturday each month, and have not missed as yet!

I attended Denny Park's Church Council meeting a couple of weeks ago to present the possibility of using their space for our traditional Thanksgiving Dinner. The vote was unanimous to work together on the Thanksgiving Dinner, so I will be coordinating the dinner between the two churches within the next 10 days. Look for sign up sheets and announcements of what is needed soon.

The importance of this program in the homeless community has heightened as people over and over let us know that if it were not for Saturday Soup and Movies, they would not eat, or have very little on Saturday and the weekend. Believe me, this program is very important. I again thank Denny Park Lutheran for their outreach to us and the community in need.

From your Call Committee: Despite all the physical changes going on with Gethsemane the Call Committee is making progress. We have completed all the forms containing statistics, goals, dreams, challenges and compiled summaries of all the input we have received from the congregation. The final item is a written profile of Gethsemane which really gives a picture of who we are and where we are going and hope to go. This should be completed by the week of October 24 which thus completes the packet. This will be looked at by the council at their November meeting and we should have it to present to the congregation by early December. At this point we once again welcome your input. The next step is submitting the packet to the synod and meeting with the Bishop. Candidate names (usually 3-5 names) will then be given to us and packets sent to them. Hopefully soon thereafter we can begin the interview process. It sometimes seems like a slow process as we search for the right person to lead us into the next phase of the life of Gethsemane, but these are also exciting times as we look to the future in our new home. As always we welcome your input, support and prayers.

Words of Grace And Blessing For All

“Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.”
Philippians 4:4-7

In this month of Thanksgiving, these words from Philippians are words of grace and blessing for all of us. And they are very good words for those of us in our synod who work with candidates for the public ministry in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA).

Our synod has one of the highest numbers of candidates and applicants. The people and congregations here in Northwest Washington are being attentive to the work of the Holy Spirit in our midst in lifting up women and men for ministry in the whole church.

Candidacy in the ELCA is a special process of formation. When someone begins discerning the call of God for public ministry, they enter this pathway of learning and spiritual growth. The process begins with an application. There is then an initial interview with a member of the synod candidacy committee. Along with the application, their home congregation affirms the applicant by registering them for candidacy. There is a significant psychological evaluation. When all the initial steps are complete,, the applicant meets with the candidacy committee for an entrance interview. Here the committee has a conversation with the applicant based on an autobiographical essay. The goal here is readiness for learning and formation. Once the candidate is entranced,

she or he can begin their education and preparation for public ministry. A member of the candidacy committee is appointed to walk with each candidate throughout the process.

At the next step - endorsement, usually in the second year - the candidate officially declares which roster, which form of leadership, they want to be on: ordained ministry, Associate in Ministry, Diaconal ministry, or Deaconess. (Our synod is also unique in having candidates for each of the four rosters.) The final step is approval, at the end of the educational process. Once approved, a candidate is available for call to the roster for which they have prepared.

It is a real gift and joy to work with these candidates. They are women and men who, having heard God's call to proclamation and service, commit their lives to learning, growth in faith, and the love and care for God's people in the congregations of the ELCA. The Candidacy Committee is a hard-working, committed group from around our synod who meet for a full day every month in this ministry. Besides the monthly meeting, the committee prepares in various way for interviews with candidates and each stays in contact with and works on the needs of the individuals assigned to them.

As a congregation leader you can help by being informed about the process. Read more about it at the link below. Invite me, Pastor Nancy Winder, Assistant to the Bishop for Candidacy, to speak at an Adult Forum in your congregation, or to preach at Sunday worship.

Here 'n There

If you have a candidate in your congregation, make sure the whole community knows about what they're doing and their progress in their preparation, and support them financially by paying all or part of their tuition.

If you don't have a candidate, pay attention to those people in your congregation who just might have a call to public ministry. Sometimes it just takes a word from someone else to open a heart to this call.

So in this month of thanksgiving, offer prayers of rejoicing and thanks to God for all the people in our synod who are hearing God's call to follow Christ as public leaders in our church. Pray for them, and for our Candidacy Committee, that the Holy Spirit will continue to bless us with all the gifts of all God's people.

Here 'n There

- The congregation of **Salem in Mount Vernon presented a check to Fir-Conway Lutheran** to support their salmon BBQ event, a fundraiser for Josephine Sunset Home. From this event, Josephine received from Fir-Conway and others a check for \$6,000.
- **First Lutheran in Mount Vernon** provides a dinner the last Tuesday of the month at *Friendship House*, a shelter for the homeless.
- Every three months **the members of Prince of Peace in SeaTac** provides a week of meals for the homeless women sheltered at Lake Burien Presbyterian Church.
- **Prince of Peace in Shoreline** is joining others for a community concert on Sunday, Nov 3. The concert is to raise money for the *North Helpline: Emergency Services and Foodbank*. The food bank sees more than 900 families each week, with 35 new families enrolling each week.
- **Peace in Silvana** filled 450 school bags to send to Lutheran World Relief.
- The women of the **Lutheran Church in the San Juans** gathered in September to work on kits for Lutheran World Relief. They were able to put-together: 51 layettes, 57 health kits, 85 school kits and 25 sewing kits.
- **Central in Seattle** is celebrating its 120th year as a congregation. A celebration service will be held at 11 a.m. on All Saint's Sunday, November 7.
- A cooperative effort between **Bethany in Seattle and SHARE** (Seattle Housing and Rescue Effort) began on July 15 giving homeless men a safe and dry place to sleep at night. The men who stay at Bethany use the Fellowship Hall and have access to the

kitchen. One of SHARE's stated goals is that they leave the facility clean or cleaner when they leave. Bethany reports that the men have done an excellent job.

- **Faith Lutheran Young Adult Ministry (YAM) in Redmond** has begun a Bible study called *Take The Plunge*. The Bible study focuses on building community, trust and an open interpretation of God's Word.
- Members of **Prince of Peace in Everett** worshipped with inmates at the Shelton Correctional Center on October 2.
- Work is being done to bring power, light and water to the parking lot at **Our Redeemer's in Seattle**. The reason? To make the parking lot a place where ministry can happen--hosting Tent City 3 or neighborhood events.

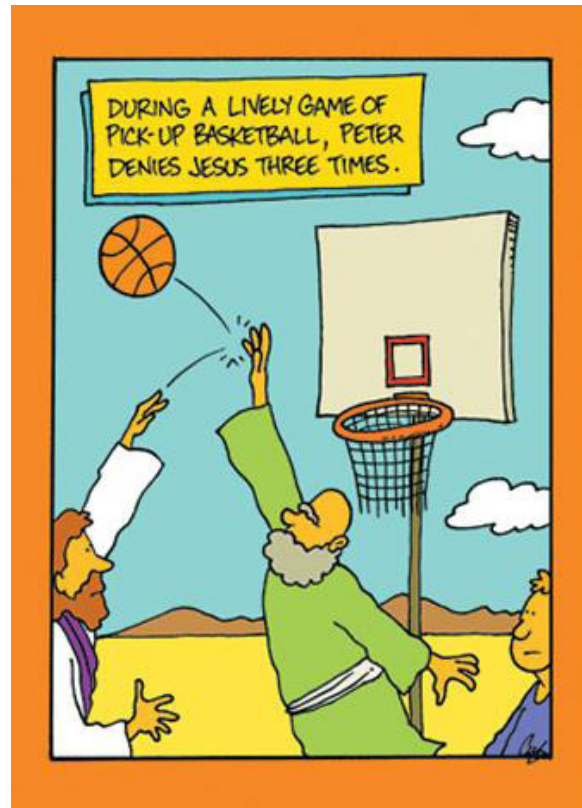

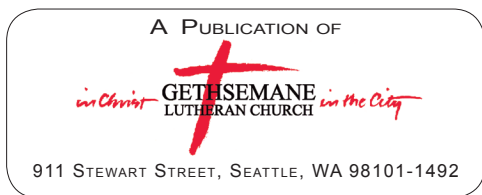
