Our last Sunday at our current location will be October 3, 2010. We vacate the premises on October 7th. Our new worship space will be across the street on the eleventh floor of our good neighbors, the Children's Hospital Research Institute. Our offices will be located at our sister congregation, Denny Park Lutheran Church, 766 John St. Soup and Movies will also be serving guests at Denny Park Lutheran, starting Saturday, September 4th. Committee, council meetings and choir rehearsal will take place at Denny Park. Our Wednesday noon Communion services will be held in

the empty store front located on Stewart St. in the Aspira Apartment building. We are truly thankful to all of our good neighbors who have accommodated us during this time of "diaspora".

I know that wherever Gethsemane is -- whether on the eleventh floor in worship, or at Denny Park in offices, meetings and choir rehearsal or in the retail store front in the Aspira Apartment for Wednesday noon communion services -- God is blessing us, and all those with whom we come into contact. Now it's time for us to continue to believe those rich promises of God.

As your interim pastor and friend, I am very proud of the bold, faithful steps you have taken as a beloved people of God. May this prayer from our ELW "Evening Prayers" be yours:

*"O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."*

## **Open Door Annual Gala**



Open Door Ministries (ODM), an extended ministry of the Northwest Washington Synod, will be holding its Tenth Annual Gala Dinner Auction on

Saturday, November 6, 2010, 5:00-9:30 p.m. at the Brockey Center on the South Seattle Community College Campus in West Seattle. This community college is well known for its fine culinary department, which will be serving the meal.

# August Council Highlights

- Oct. 3rd is the last Sunday for us to be at Gethsemane. The office will be closed all week as the move to offices in Denny Park is being made. Members able to help with packing at Gethsemane October 4, 5 or 6 are asked to call the church office (683 3620) and leave their name.
- Although offerings and plate offerings are down the good news is that expenditures are also down.
- Elizabeth Steele brought the report from the Executive Committee. It is difficult to get a quorum of fifty people for making the decisions that have and will be facing us. The current Constitution reads "C10.04 Fifty voting members shall constitute a quorum (unless there are fewer than 100 voting members; in that event 50% of the members shall constitute a quorum)".
- The Council voted that C10.04 become: Voting members present at the meeting shall constitute a quorum. This language was adopted from the Model Constitution for Congregations of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America as of 2007. Gethsemane's present Constitution was adopted January 30, 1994 and Revised February, 1996. The vote is scheduled for September 12, 2010.
- Other Amendments relative to Congregation Meetings will remain the same. "The call for each special meeting shall specify the purposes for which it is to be held and no other business shall be transacted. Notice of all meetings of this congregation shall be given at the services of worship on the preceding two consecutive Sundays and by mail to all voting members at least 10 days in advance of the date of the meeting. The posting of such notice in the regular mail, with the regular postage affixed or paid, sent to the last known address of such members shall be sufficient. Voting by proxy or absentee ballot shall not be permitted. Lastly, all actions by the congregation shall be by majority vote except as otherwise provided in this constitution or the articles of incorporation or by law."
- Pastor Atik reported on the on-going discussions with Jean Lagasse of Children's. The only charge to the church will be for a security person. Parking spaces at Aspira will still be available on Sundays. The Postal Station at 6th and Stewart will hold the church's mail. Mail will be picked up daily from that location during the time we are away from 9th & Stewart. This means that no address change needs to be made while Gethsemane offices are at Denny Park. All those persons who use Gethsemane's address for mail will not need to change the church's address. These persons will be able to collect their mail at Denny Park.
- During August, Pat Champion and her crew of volunteers will be moving all the Soup and Movies essentials to Denny Park Lutheran. The program will begin the first of September at that location.
- Committee heads and staff members have been assigned responsibility for determining in their respective areas what is to be moved and stored, given away, recycled or discarded.
- A great picnic is being planned for Rally Day Sunday, September 12, 2010 in the Garden Court and Fellowship Lounge. The church will provide hamburgers and hot dogs. Members are invited to bring a salad or a dessert.
- Kris Okerlund worked over-time finding places to bring 5 gallon containers and 1 gallon containers of latex paint, burnt out florescent tubes, metal and scrap wood. Many things, including some chairs, are still available in the Mission Room for anyone who wishes to take them. Few of the things offered were taken. What remains is being delivered to Good-Will.
- Rachel Pesis, Lee Mattson, Kris Okerlund and Doris Rolander are winding up the job of getting the library inventory reduced and the remaining books packed for storage.
- The staff consisting of David Barela, Greg Keels, Charles Cadwallader, Shawnrene Keppel, Kareen Snider and Sara Williams are being supported by the Church Council and Pastor Atik as they cope with the stress of moving into temporary quarters. The Rev. Penelope Guntermann who is with Lutheran Counseling Network will be moving to an office in Denny Park also. The Consultant to Clergy who has also had office space at Gethsemane will be moving to the Lutheran Campus Ministry building by the University.

**GROW REPORT ~ Update # 6**

**July 16** – Church committee representatives, Pastor Atik, and John Schwartz met with Jena Lagasse of Children’s Hospital Research Committee to finalize details relating to the Sunday worship schedule. We will be authorized to worship from 9am – 12:30pm on Sundays beginning October 10, 2010.

Adult Forum – 9am

Worship service 10:00am

Fellowship 11:15am

Other special services other than Sundays include Christmas Eve, Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday.

Our only expense for these uses will be the salary of one security guard.

**July 21** – GROW committee met with representatives of Denny Park Lutheran Church to look at available office space. We can rent the top floor of their office building for the transition time. There will be space for Pastor Atik, Charles Cadwallader, office Administrator, Kareen Snider, Director of GCS, Shawnrene Keppel, Office Asst, Sara Williams, Accountant, David Barela, Music Director, and Penelope Guntermann, Lutheran Counseling Network. Denny Park also offered space for music rehearsals, council meetings, and midweek Lenten services. Council is expected to approve the rent agreement and office staff is busy with the set up details.

**July 27** – GROW committee met and discussed the new garden design. Several questions arose and suggestions that would need clarification with the architects. GROW sheduled a meeting to finalize details.

**August 1** – Informal coffee hour discussion with the congregation to talk about the emotions involved in “moving” Wayne Sneva led the discussion and several members shared their own stories about relocating and how they learned from these experiences. Most experienced a new freedom as they disposed of furniture and personal items that didn’t fit into their new homes. Dates were announced for moving from Gethsemane to Children’s Research Center. Last worship service at Gethsemane will be October 3. The official “move” date will be October 7. Hansen Bros. will be responsible for moving and storage of all valuables. They have many references for moving and storing church property. Each church committee will be responsible for their area of property. They will decide what will be stored, moved, donated, or disposed of and pack accordingly.

**August 3** – GROW committee met with architects, Jim Olson and Bob Jakubik. More ideas were presented concerning the south garden wall, fountain and walkway materials. The architects will work on these designs and meet with GROW September 7 with plans. Sanctuary designs will also be presented at that time with several options for seating.

## *Fun Facts from the archives*

### The Chapel's Four Apostles

There are four hand carved wooden statues on the wall in the Memorial Chapel commissioned by Gethsemane in 1960 and created by an artist in Italy. They represent the four Gospel writers of the New Testament. Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

The apostles have a symbol at each of their feet. What are these symbols?

John, located closest to the altar, was closest to Jesus, and without a halo, is symbolized by an eagle because faith starts with an eternal overview of Jesus, His ascension and divine nature. Christians look on eternity without flinching on their journey towards their union with God.

Matthew is symbolized by a winged man or angel because God's purpose begins with Jesus' genealogy from Abraham, to Jesus' incarnation and Christ's human nature. Christians should use their reasoning for salvation.

Luke is symbolized by an ox or bull, a figure of sacrifice, service and strength because the universal mission of Jesus begins with Zechariah's duties in the temple, then on to Jesus' sacrifice, passion and crucifixion. Christians are prepared for service in following Christ.

Mark is symbolized by a lion, courage and monarchy because the opening events of Jesus' public life begins with John the Baptist, like a roaring lion to Jesus' resurrection and Christ as king. Christians are courageous on their path of salvation.

The Apostle statues were installed in 1961 in the Memorial Chapel given to the glory of God by Charles O. and Hild E. Horn.

The Apostles are in the above order from the chapel altar to the exit door.

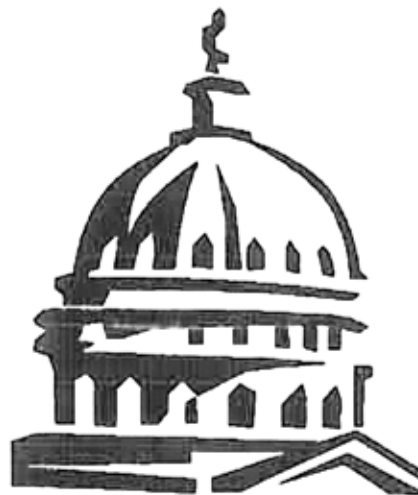

## ***Remember The Sabbath And Keep It Holy***

Summer is over, not when the weather changes, but when programs and activities pick up again. Some people dread the thought of carpools, hectic schedules, homework, preparations and practices. Other people welcome the structure of routine and the lively hum of a busy life. But from either

perspective all Christians ask themselves, "How does faith and church life fit into the 24/7 culture of the 21st century?"

*Remember the Sabbath and keep it Holy.* There is probably a reason that this spiritual discipline was included in the Ten Commandments; it's that important. We look at nature and see the dormancy of plants, the hibernation of animals and even the resting cycles of insects. Add to that observation a study that was done in the 1960s by the Department of Architectural Studies at Sheffield University that showed that buildings used heavily every day of the week suffered "stress" and were unlikely to last as long as buildings that had one 24 hour period of "rest" during the week. One test does not prove or disprove anything, but it is interesting how all of creation follows patterns of Sabbath.

For us to remember the Sabbath, we need to take time for rest, relaxation, and reconnection and not think of it as a waste of time. How about making plans now as we anticipate the end of summer, to make time to remember the Sabbath; make time to worship as a family. It's true, sometimes for kids, worship isn't rest, relaxation, or reconnection and family attendance becomes sporadic. Rather than eschewing

worship attendance and giving the message that it isn't important, talk with the pastor and worship committee about what might make worship more meaningful to your family and to other families.

After resting in the Word in worship, remembering the Sabbath means the whole day. So take home the themes from worship and repeat them at home. Read and talk about the scripture readings at home, even pick a passage to memorize as a family. And then do something relaxing. What hobby or activity helps you relax? How can you share that with your family? How can you invite others to be a part of your Sabbath relaxation? Do things on the Sabbath that make God smile. Do things that make you smile.

Reconnection is another purpose of Sabbath. Reconnect with your children, asking them to share their dreams and hopes. Share with them the joy they have brought to your life. Encourage them to share their hobbies with you, play with them, affirm their uniqueness and giftedness, and let them know they are a valued child of God.

Reconnection with friends and neighbors, other church members, and other people who would welcome your interest in their lives is also the perfect way to remember the Sabbath. Invite one or two to share your Sunday meal with you and participate in your family Sabbath. You might also reconnect with those who have gone before, taking flowers to the cemetery, telling the stories that made those people unique and important, and share the values they passed on to you. Honor their presence among the saints.

## Remember The Sabbath

And then in our asphalt commute, our electronic vistas, and our flurry of words and symbols, take time on the Sabbath to reconnect with creation. Who wouldn't like to go to the park, the beach, or even a walk around the neighborhood? Who wouldn't like to bike as a family along a trail, take a boat ride, or climb a hill in the woods?

Remember the Sabbath...rest, relax, and reconnect...and keep it Holy. As a spiritual discipline, Sabbath is set apart from the rest of the week as something intentionally different. Dinner might taste different, with different people around the table, different food, or different pace of the meal. The sounds might be different as family members unplug their headsets, turn

off their ipods, and listen to something that the family has selected together. There may be intentional sounds of harmony, affirmation, blessing, and maybe even singing. It may be different because there are no conflicting schedules to draw the family in different directions because the day was planned ahead of time.

As summer ends, whether we embrace the change or dread it, planning for Sabbath deserves our faithful attention. What value is more important than the one God built into creation in order to sustain it? Remember the Sabbath and keep it Holy...you'll be glad you did.

## Here 'n There

- **Central Lutheran in Bellingham** holds a potluck for seniors at noon on the second Monday of every month.

- **Greg Pearey, grandson of Ida Morgan, member of First Lutheran in Bothell**, has been drafted by the New York Mets. He had just completed his junior year at Oregon State University.
